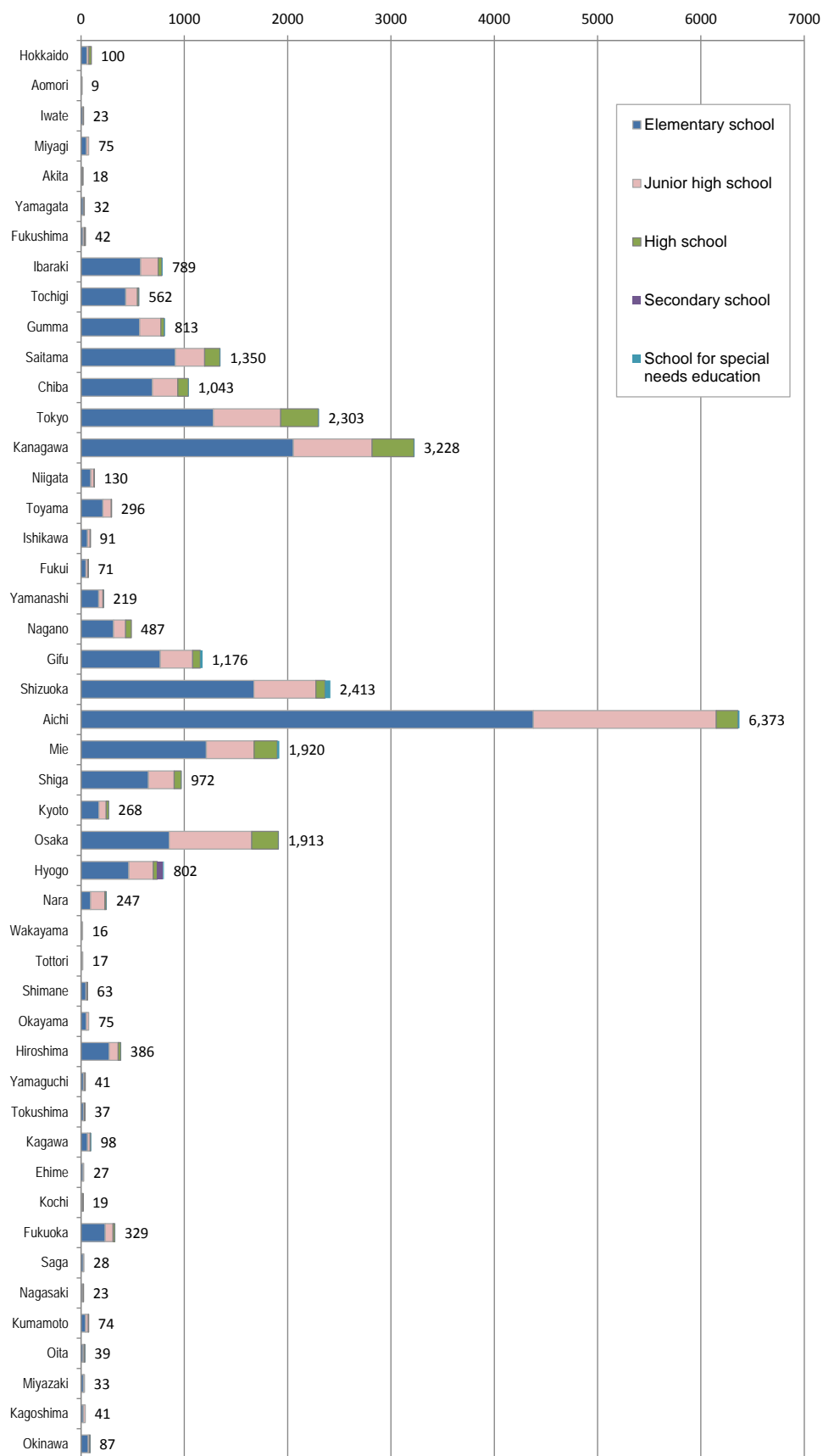

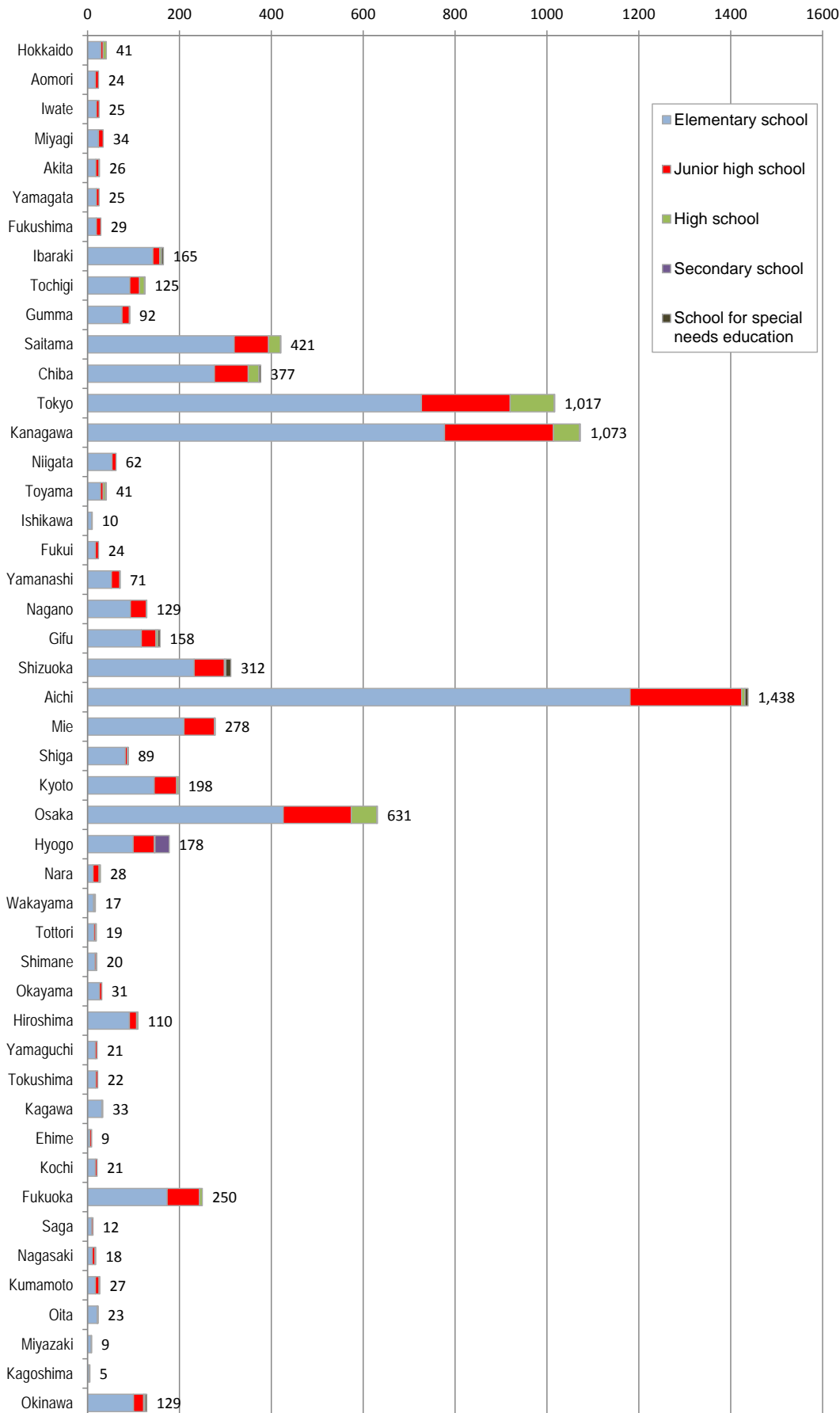

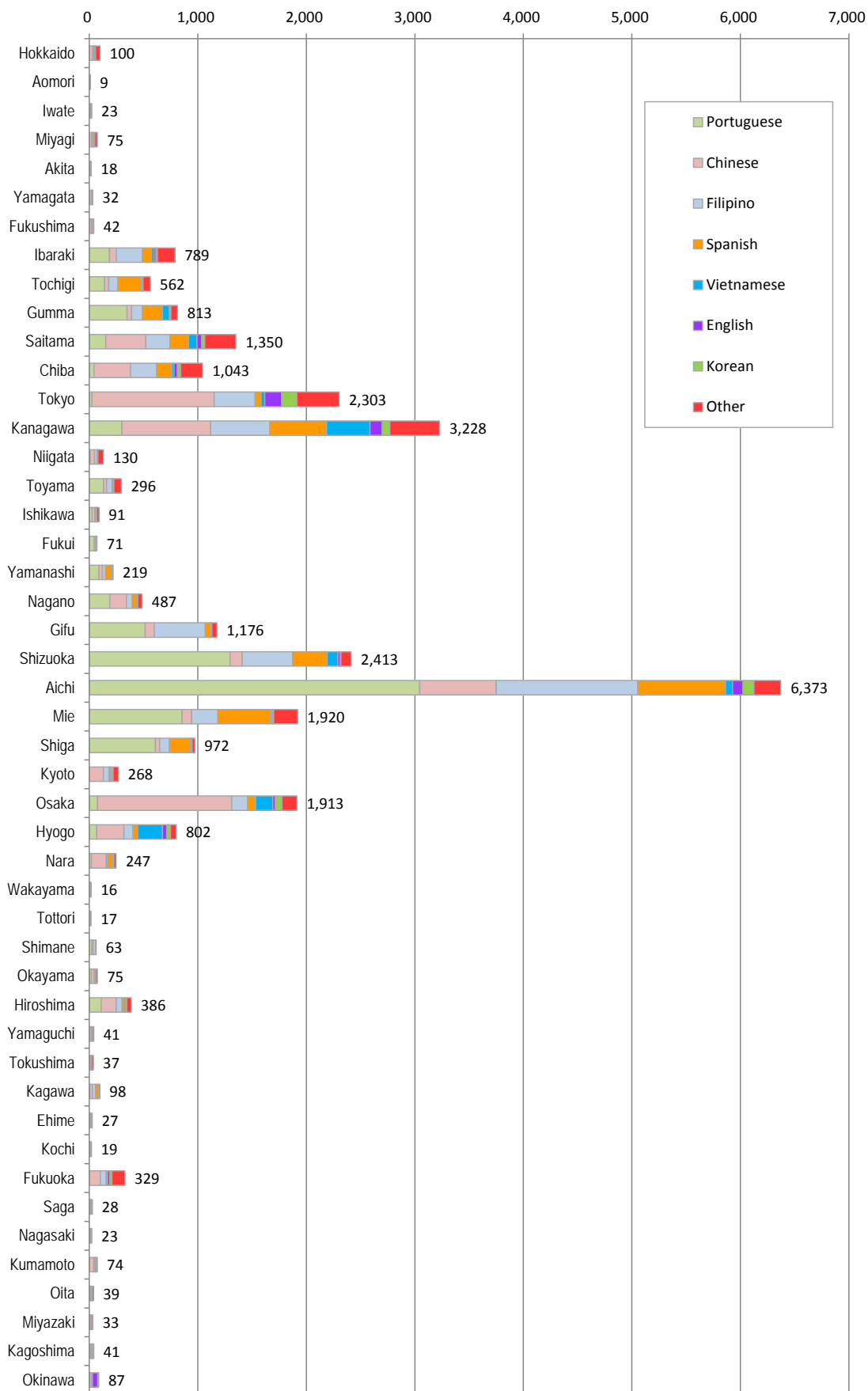

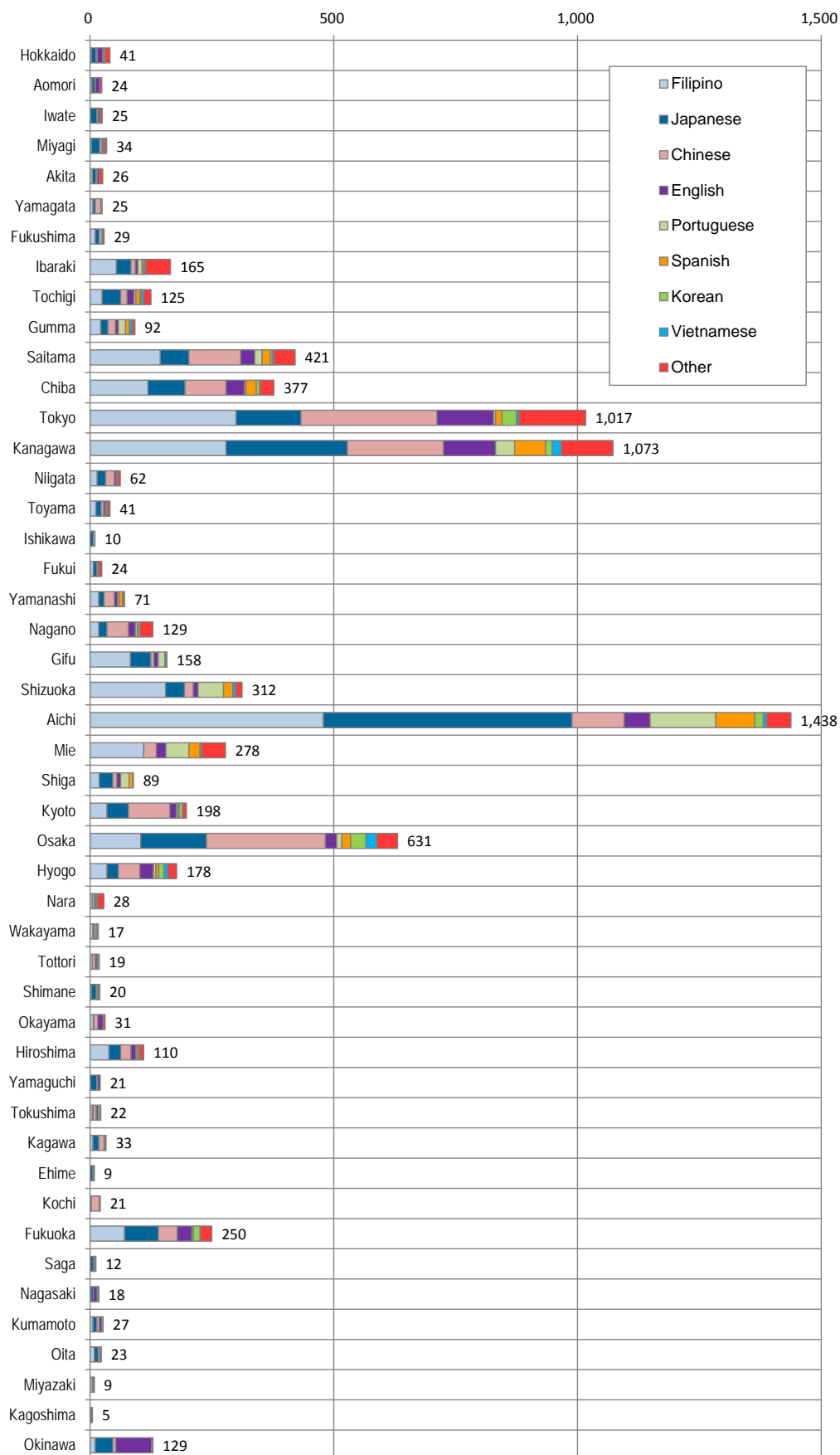

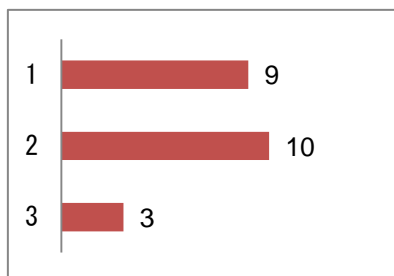

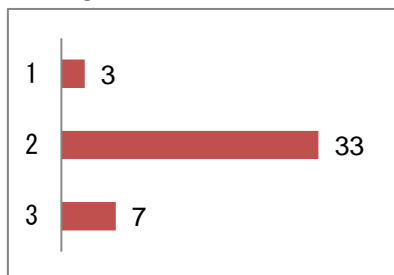
(1) Number of prefectures (elementary / junior high schools)



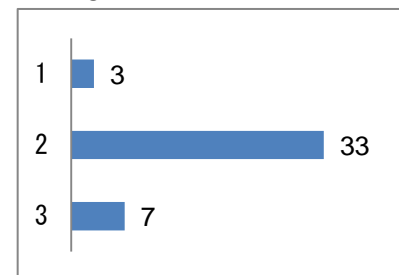
(2) Number of municipalities (elementary / junior high schools)
