

2012 – The Los Angeles Declaration 5th IOC World Conference on Women and Sport ⇒ Recommends more resources should be dedicated to developing women's skills in management and leadership

2014 6th IWG World

6th IWG World Conference on Women and Sport ⇒Brighton Plus Helsinki 2014 Declaration ⇒Recommends women occupy 40% of decisionmaking positions

International Paralympic Committee (IPC) sets target of women occupying 50%, up from previous 30%, of decision-making positions

1st ASEAN-Japan Ministerial Meeting on Sports held in October 2017 in Myanmar. The ASEAN nations and Japan agreed to cooperate in the 4 areas below.

- 1. Development of physical education teachers and coaches
- 2. Increasing participation of women in sports
- 3. Advancing sports for people with disabilities
- 4. Capacity building for anti-doping

- Distributing training journals for women athletes



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










We are advancing study to ensure women's full participation.




Activities of top female athletes

Since 1996, the medal acquisition rate for women is higher than for men (except for 2016 Rio Olympics).




Activities of top female athletes

At Pyeongchang, women outperformed men in number and proportion of medals won.




Support for Female Athletes

Junior female athletes


- Nutrition support for female athletes


Supporting athlete's dual careers


