16TH ASIA-PACIFIC TRAINING WORKSHOP ON EIU EIU, FOSTERING GLOBAL CITIZENSHIP

1. BACKGROUND

Acknowledging the critical importance of *preparing educators towards a Culture of Peace*, APCEIU has been organizing capacity-building training workshops on **Education for International Understanding (EIU)** for educators. **The Asia-Pacific Training Workshop on EIU (APTW)**, APCEIU's flagship programme, has been held annually since 2001. Designed as a 'Training of Trainers (TOT)', APTW aims to enhance participants' knowledge, skills, and commitment to EIU and **GCED (Global Citizenship Education)** and furthermore enable them to competently design and implement EIU/GCED (training) activities in their local and national contexts.



GCED has become a new educational goal to be achieved by the international community by the adoption of the **Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)** and **Education 2030 Framework for Action**. This year's APTW, under the subtitle of "**EIU**, **Fostering Global Citizenship**", will provide a platform where participants learn, experience, share and reflect upon various issues on education to foster global citizenship

in this complex, interconnected society. Fostering global citizenship is in line with EIU's core values in terms of the promotion of **learning to live together** to forge more just, peaceful, and inclusive society.

The session format of this intensive 9-day workshop includes lectures, discussions, workshops, in-depth seminars, field visits, action plan development as well as formal and informal wok in small groups where participants can learn from each other and from the experiences they encounter during the Workshop.

Education for International Understanding (EIU),

is a holistic and multi-dimensional education initiative to promote to **learning** to live together for a Culture of Peace. EIU advocates participatory democracy, human rights and dignity, social and economic equity, ecological sustainability, and peaceful reconciliation of conflicts. EIU pedagogy emphasizes transformative and inclusive education, relevance of knowledge, empowerment of learners, as well as holistic approaches.



- To expand the participants' understanding and knowledge of key concepts and principles of EIU/GCED
- To reorient the participants' perspectives towards a Culture of Peace through critical and reflective analysis of the current educational issues
- To strengthen the participants' practical skills to design and implement EIU/GCED training programmes tailored to their respective local context

3. APPLICATION ELIGIBILITY AND SELECTION CRITERIA

Candidates must fulfill the following requirements:

- Be teacher trainers/educators with a minimum 5-year career experience <u>or</u> in a position to impact on teacher education policies and curriculum development if not directly training educators
- Have <u>commitment to implement EIU/GCED training workshops within 6 months</u> after the participation of the workshop
- Have aptitude to carry out EIU/GCED activities in their local setting
- Be proficient in spoken and written English
- ※ Participants will be selected by a screening committee, composed of international experts on EIU/GCED.
 - APPLICATION: All of the application documents must be sent to APCEIU at ent1@unescoapceiu.org by <u>3 June 2016</u>.
 NOTIFICATION: Notification of selection in the form of invitation letters will be sent to the National Commissions for UNESCO by <u>17 June 2016</u>.
 CONFIRMATION: All selected participants must register by <u>24 June 2016</u> at the latest. Late registration cannot be accepted and will be considered as cancellation of participation. In case of cancellation, the participation invitation will be forwarded to the next applicant on the waiting list.

9. WORKSHOP COSTS

• WORKSHOP / STAYING COST:

10. MAIN COMPONENTS OF THE WORKSHOP

- I. SESSIONS: Lectures on introduction of EIU/GCED and its key issue areas and pedagogical approaches, participatory and interactive workshops, in-depth seminars, engaging dialogue, study visits to relevant sites, and small group activities.
- **II. REFLECTION & SYNTHESIS:** Sessions designed to recap the learning points of the past sessions, allow participants to share reflections with fellow participants and facilitators, and link across different sessions.
- **III. WORKSHOP PLANNING:** Process of planning and designing EIU/GCED training workshops specific to participants' local context. Guided by facilitators and APCEIU, the planned training workshops will be demonstrated by the participants at the end of the workshop.
- **IV. CULTURAL EXCHANGE:** Opportunity to build a sense of community among participants while sharing cultural elements and insights with one another.
