
Machine translation is simple. The machine statistically finds out the most appropriate match from translation data. A set of data is like: "kaming machine ga nagaku natta;" My hair got longer." It is broken up into smaller pieces, such as "kami; my hair" and "nagaku natta" into machine translation, the machine matches the best pieces of data and produces "The day got longer." However, machine translation has several problems. If translated sentences are inaccurate, we must correct them. In addition, it is sometimes difficult for us to recognize inaccurate translations.

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If we take an example, like "bukatsu de kaeri ga osoku natta," we can see how inaccurate sometimes machine translation is.




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
