1) Be in residence for at least 2 years and complete a minimum of 30 credits of course work.			
2) Complete a supervised program of independent study.			
3) Submit a Master's thesis and pass an oral examination related to it.			
(Doctoral Program)			
To be awarded a doctoral degree, all students are required to:			
1) Be in residence for at least 3 years and complete a minimum of 8 credits of course work.			
2) Complete a supervised program of independent study.			
3) Submit a doctoral dissertation and pass an oral examination related to it.
