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Flower Sales in 2016

In 2014, Margaret opened a new flower shop in Nagoya. Her shop was just in front of a railway station and soon became popular. Her customers included children, teenagers, and working people who used the station. At the end of 2016, she looked carefully at her monthly sales for the whole year. She made a graph to make the yearly trends easier to see.

According to her data, flowers sold best in December. During the Christmas season, people buy flowers for Christmas parties, and some people choose flower bouquets as presents. Also, flowers are a common feature when celebrating the New Year, and people tend to buy more expensive flowers at the end of the year. In March, there are many opportunities to send flower bouquets, such as graduation ceremonies and job transfers. Similarly, in May, people often buy flower bouquets for Mother's Day.
