- resume international mobility which has been stagnated by the Covid-19 pandemic and Russia's war of aggression, under cooperation of G7 members
- advocate for access to inclusive and equitable quality education for all, particularly children and students in Ukraine and in crisis situations around the world, particularly girls
- note both positive and negative impacts of the development of the latest digital technologies including generative AI on education
