# Support for the reopening of schools

In order to converge the nation's efforts for suppressing as soon as possible the spread of the novel coronavirus epidemic, many businesses cooperated in temporarily shutting down their operations in March. After that, however, the numbers of newly infected persons, particularly in urban areas, increased, as well as the number of infected persons whose route of infection was unclear. Depending on the situation in each region, preparations for recovery, including the reopening of schools, need to move forward, without letting up at all in continuing precautionary measures against COVID-19.

For the reopening of schools, support will be given for the purchase of masks and disinfectants that will be necessary for ensuring measures against the reoccurrence of the coronavirus are thoroughly taken. Efforts will also be made to support supplementary lessons to make up for areas not taught yet, ensure the mental health of children, and lessen the financial burden on parents and students.

# Measures against COVID-19 at schools

- MEXT will <u>aim at the distribution of two cloth masks from April</u> (one mask in April and one after May) <u>to students and teachers</u> at all elementary schools, junior and senior high schools, schools for special needs education, upper secondary specialized training schools, etc. MEXT will <u>also support school operators in purchasing cloth masks, disinfectants, non-contact-type thermometers, and other hygiene supplies.</u>
- <u>Cloth masks will be distributed</u> to kindergarten teachers, and <u>support will be provided for purchasing children's masks, disinfectants, and other supplies for preventing infections.</u>
- Support will be provided for efforts by school operators to reduce the risk of infection on school buses for students of special needs education schools (reducing the number of students riding one bus, etc.).
- MEXT will revise health education texts for teachers as well as health education materials for elementary and junior and senior high schools in order to help teachers and students cope with and follow anti-coronavirus measures.
- Schools will improve their hygienic environment, such as restrooms, etc., and prepare an environment that ensures students can study and live safely and securely.

# Learning instruction, mental care

- MEXT will <u>place additional instructors at schools to support instruction in curriculum areas not taught yet</u> as a result of the temporary school closures, as well as help cover necessary expenses for the additional assignment of teachers.
- MEXT will support the covering of necessary expenses for the additional placement of teachers and school counselors in order to provide mental health care
  to children whose daily life rhythm has been disrupted by the temporary shutdowns of schools, businesses, etc.

# **Experiential learning activities for children**

In order to rejuvenate children and ensure their healthy development, <u>MEXT will support and enhance</u> outdoor activities for children to experience nature conducted by youth education groups and others, opportunities for children to enjoy playing sports safely and securely, and opportunities for children to engage in high-quality cultural and art activities.

# Cancellation, postponement of school trips, responding to stopping of school lunches

- <u>In regards to cancellation charges arising due to the cancellation or postponement of school trips because of the temporary closing of schools, MEXT will provide a fixed amount of necessary funds to local governments and other school operators in order to ease the financial burden on parents.</u>
- MEXT will request school operators to refund to parents the cost for school lunches during the temporary closure period. MEXT will provide support to school operators to cover the costs for the refunds to parents and lunch cancellation charges.

# Support to students in hardship situations

- MEXT will provide support to high school students whose family finances have been suddenly changed, through exemption from tuition payments and provision of High School Supplemental Scholarship Fund. Additionally, the ministry has requested municipal boards of education that financial support for school attendance in compulsory education should be dealt flexibly.
- MEXT will provide support through scholarship loans, scholarships and tuition exemptions to students whose families need financial assistance due to a sudden change in their household finances.
- The national government will provide support to enable universities and other higher educational institutions to give careful consideration, including the postponement or exemption from payment of tuition fees, to students facing financial hardships due to the impact of the COVID-19 crisis
- JASSO will provide repayment assistance, including the postponement of repayment or reduction of the repayment amount, to those facing difficulty repaying scholarship loans.
- MEXT will request economic organizations to\_provide sufficient relevant information to job-hunting students and to prevent the withdrawal of employment offers to students scheduled to graduate, and will ask universities and other institutions to provide support to students.

# Flexible support to Japanese and international overseas students

- MEXT will exercise flexibility in the handling of scholarships, etc. for Japanese overseas students for whom it is difficult to return promptly to Japan because of the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, for Japanese overseas students who continue to study online at the universities they studied at abroad after their return to Japan, and for international overseas students who cannot come to Japan as scheduled to ensure that they have opportunities to learn.
- MEXT will ease the financial burden on Japanese students study abroad again.

# Ensuring children's learning during the school closures

Even in emergency periods like the temporary school closings due to COVID-19, MEXT supports children's learning through a combination of home learning including online learning and interviews with teachers to support children's learning and ascertain their learning progress so as to ensure that children can continue their learning. In line with this, MEXT is rapidly moving forward with support for preparing environments that will allow children to utilize ICT to continue to study at home and elsewhere.

# Support to prevent the interruption of children's learning

- Depending on the situation of the school and students, MEXT supports home learning, such as learning utilizing paper texts, television broadcasts, etc., learning utilizing online materials, and learning utilizing interactive online instruction.
- \* MEXT will soon announce that teachers are allowed to evaluate students' learning and its results the same way as in regular classes when students who cannot attend school learn at home by utilizing ICT, such as through interactive online lessons and learning with online materials.



#### √ Learning utilizing hard copy learning materials, TV broadcasts, etc.

- For children whose families do not have Internet access, appropriate hard copy learning materials will be provided to them, and teachers will provide support through telephone consultations, home visits, etc.
- TV broadcasts will be utilized, such as NHK ETV (special editions continued until May 1).

## √ Learning utilizing online materials

- Enhancement of MEXT's "Children's Learning Support Website"

  \*\*Inclusion and updating of tables listing videos and learning materials organized by the area and units for each subject.
- Collaboration with METI's "Future Classroom" project

### √ Teaching interactively online

- Interactive online instruction utilizing smartphones or families' personal computers (e.g., using video conferencing systems).
- Providing online materials corresponding to the contents of textbooks so that online lessons using textbooks can be conducted smoothly.
- Maintaining communication between school/teacher and student /family by confirming online learning progress and monitoring student's health.
- Preparation of guidelines for using tablets provided by schools at home.
- Support for assigning instructors or additional teachers to assist children in self-study and learning who are cared for at schools while regular lessons are suspended.





# Primary, secondary education: Prompt preparation of ICT environment



- Provision of "1 computer per 1 student" at the compulsory education stage ahead of scheduled target of 2023, and support for provision of assistive data I/O devices for students with disabilities.
- Support for <u>provision of LTE communications environment (mobile routers)</u> for families without Wi-Fi access.
- Support for <u>provision of communications devices like webcams, microphones, etc. for teachers</u> to facilitate smooth, interactive communication between the school and students.



- Support for enhancement of teacher ICT training conducted by local governments, through assigning of ICT education advisors, curriculum specialists, etc.
- Prompt implementation of revisions to the Copyright Act in 2018 to promote smooth utilization of copyrighted materials for online instruction.

# Higher education: Preparation of environment for distance learning at universities

- Full dissemination to all students of universities' ability to flexibly deal with the authorization of credits and graduation at universities and colleges of technology through the utilization of distance learning and supplementary lectures.
- Full dissemination to all students that it will be possible to take interactive distance learning classes at home and that cap rules on credits even if some parts of regular lessons are conducted as distance lessons will not be applied.
- Support for <u>preparation of technical environment</u>, including online equipment (webcams, microphones, etc.) for teachers and mobile routers for students, necessary <u>for conducting distance education</u>. MEXT will also compile and <u>disseminate good examples of distance classes</u> and support the efforts of all universities.
- MEXT will consult with telecommunication carriers in collaboration with other relevant ministries to reduce the communication costs for students.
- MEXT will facilitate the prompt implementation of revisions to the Copyright Act in 2018 to promote the smooth utilization of copyrighted materials for online instruction at universities, etc.



# Securing places for children

 Communities and schools will collaborate and cooperate to ensure that children who cannot stay at their home while schools are temporarily closed have a place to stay and receive learning opportunities.





# Support to university hospitals, etc. for infectious disease research

At this time, MEXT particularly extends its gratitude to everyone involved in treating the novel coronavirus on the frontlines at hospitals and who are engaged in related research and development. The establishment and strengthening of treatment systems at frontline hospitals and the development of drug treatments and vaccines are urgent issues.

For this, MEXT will make all efforts for: 1) the strengthening of the research base and the acceleration of research for developing countermeasures against COVID-19, and 2) the strengthening of treatment systems and training at hospitals.

## Strengthening of the research base and acceleration of research related to COVID-19

- By helping to <u>strengthen research centers for infectious diseases in the Asian region</u> and promoting research using these centers, MEXT will <u>contribute to the prompt development of therapeutic drugs</u>, etc.
- In order to accelerate R&D for treatment drugs, MEXT will <u>strengthen support platforms for drug discovery</u> <u>research</u> for academia and private-sector companies.
- MEXT will support R&D for rapid testing methods that can greatly reduce the time for testing, which will
  contribute to the prompt detection of COVID-19 cases in Japan.
- MEXT will prioritize the authorization of procedures requiring the MEXT Minister's confirmation based on the Cartagena Act necessary for the conducting of genetic recombination experiments.
- MEXT will promote research by moving up the schedule for the trial use of the supercomputer Fugaku, and putting up for temporary offering the utilization of the computational resources of university and NIER supercomputers.
- MEXT will promote the acceleration of research by supporting the preparation of research infrastructure
   facilities at national universities for research showing prospects for the development of vaccines, the
   establishment of new testing methods, etc.
- MEXT will open a portal site for researchers and others providing information regarding important points for infectious disease research, research results in conjunction with MEXT, research equipment at research institutes that may be used by those engaged in research activities, etc. (


## Strengthening of treatment systems and personnel training at university hospitals

- Without being bound by conventional schemes (subsidy rate: 10/10), in order to overcome the little understood COVID-19, MEXT will <u>support the provision</u> of medical equipment such as ECMO ventilators to national, public, and private university hospitals, and the training of advanced medical personnel.
- MEXT will support the installation of ventilators, sterilizing equipment, etc. at <u>national university hospitals</u>, which are centers for regional healthcare, and the <u>training of advanced medical personnel engaged in infectious disease healthcare</u>.

# Support for sports, cultural activities

MEXT again expresses its gratitude to organizations taking the lead in cooperating to follow the restrictions on sports and cultural events requested by the Government. At the same, we are aware that, with these restrictions, the suspensions have had a great impact on freelance workers and others engaged in these activities.

In response to persons greatly affected by the Government's suspension request, the Government, with the cooperation of all relevant ministries and agencies, will make unified efforts to support individuals and organizations that have suffered damage to their business operations and daily lives as a result of the suspension of events and performances, to assist in anti-coronavirus measures for the reopening of sports and cultural facilities and the resumption of events, performances, etc. and to support the resurgence of interest and enthusiasm for sports and cultural activities.

## Measures related to cancellation fees borne by cultural facilities

**MEXT** will request that local governments appropriately manage cultural facilities introducing the designated administrator system that have lost revenues due to cancellations caused by the measures to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Revision of tax system to allow ticket buyers to waive the right for a ticket refund and declare the refund amount a tax deduction for a contribution

If persons who have purchased admission fees to cancelled cultural or artistic events waive the right for a refund, the refund amount can be considered a deduction for a contribution.

▶ New benefits for households facing hardships in daily life (Temporary Benefits for Daily Life Support [tentative title])

※Information will be provided to artists, etc. regarding what specific support systems they can utilize, based on their individual needs. XGovt. will cooperate to base support on special characteristics of needs of artists and a wide range of culture-related businesses.

#### Support for reopening cultural facilities

Support for introduction of time-stagger system for people visiting cultural facilities as a measure to ease congestion and prevent spread of COVID-**19**.

## Improvement of viewing environment using advanced technology (enhancing cultural facilities' profitability)

Through support for the production and distribution of videos, educational contents, and so on, museums will improve their viewing environments, enhance their profitability, and build interdisciplinary collaboration models.

► **Providing discounts, point coupons** to consumers who purchase tickets for sports/entertainment events

Initiatives in cooperation with other ministries, agencies

#### **Art Caravans**

Art caravans hold performances and exhibitions throughout the country by artists, including freelance artists, and performing arts groups, including students and amateurs.

MEXT will support cultural appreciation classes forced to be suspended with the closure of schools and activities for children to experience cultural activities.
